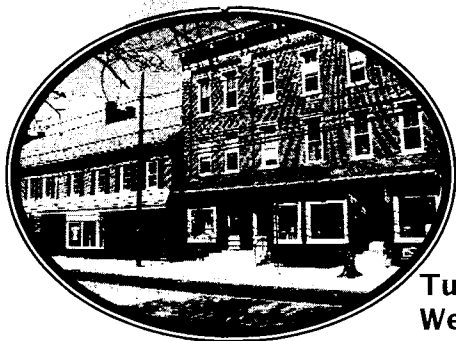

Street Sweeping Schedule

Tues, April 25 (Rain: 4/26) ODD # side.

Wed, April 26 (Rain: 4/27) EVEN #side.

NOTE: Cul de sacs will be swept completely on the first day. The sweepers may also do a portion of the other side of the street on the first day, but will complete it as necessary the following day. **Residents are urged to sweep cin- ders on their sidewalks out onto the street curb line before the street sweeping day.** (Summer sweep 6/27 (Rain: 6/28)--main arteries.)

Street Overlay Work Scheduled

The street overlay work planned by the Boro this year is scheduled for the street areas of: the section of W. Conestoga between Oak, west to N. Hoover; Kutz; N. Roberts from Main north to Conestoga; S. Custer, Main south to the RR tracks; and a portion of N. Kinzer for major base repair in preparation for future overlay, from Main northward @170 feet.

Pavilion Replacement Campaign

The Park Board has undertaken a \$55,000 Challenge Fundraising Campaign to fund the needed replacement of the former Pool Restrooms/Locker Room building, the Rotary and the Hart/Summer Arts pavilions. The current electrical services which are part of the Hart pavilion, will also be separated from the new structure. All three structures have significant deterioration. With a successful campaign, the structures are planned to be replaced by the 2018 season. The Board will be providing additional information over the next few months.

New Railroad Crossing Signal at Diller

Flashing railroad crossing signals with cross arms are now under construction at the Diller Ave. crossing. This location qualified for a federal program which involves the Railroad, the PA Public Utility Commission and Penn DOT and all public and private utilities and services which may have facilities in the project area. The project is scheduled to be completed by the end of September. Even without a signal, a driver is responsible for stopping and checking at a railroad crossing before proceeding across.

July 4th Fireworks

The New Holland Summer Arts Council has scheduled a special Fireworks display set for the New Holland community on Tuesday, July 4th. The display is to take place on the lot behind the Grace Fellowship Church, which is along S. Kinzer Ave.
