Major Neighborhood Street Work Planned

With the good fortune of having two consecutive mild winters, the Boro is planning additional areas of street overlay work than could normally be financed in one year. The Boro will continue its no interest loan program to assist residential property owners to replace curb and sidewalk where needed. The extent of the work will involve the inconvenience of a few days of no street access or parking. The major street areas planned for work this summer are: East Broad Street between North Railroad and North Roberts; East Jackson Street between Brimmer Avenue and South Kinzer Avenue and South Custer Avenue from the railroad tracks to Fulton Street.

Penn DOT has the repaving of Route 23 scheduled for this summer. The paving will be from Leola east to Kinzer Ave. This work is a continuance of the repaving project performed from Leola west to Route 30 last year.

Armed Forces Banner Ceremony

A dedication ceremony recognizing the Elanco Armed Forces Banner Project will be held at Towne Centre Green (corner of Roberts & Main) on May 25th at noon. Bring your lawn chairs and enjoy. In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will be held at the Garden Spot HS Auditorium.

The Ceremony will feature speakers, soloists and music provided by members of the New Holland Band. Speakers include Senator Mike Brubaker, Rep. Gordon Denlinger, Ruth Stonesifer, President of American Gold Star Mothers, and Col. David Wood, 28th Combat Aviation Brigade.

Museum to Host History of Weaver Chicken

What is recognized as the Tysons Food plant in New Holland has local roots and history dating back to 1937. The story begins with the initial successful sale of 17 chickens by local farmer Victor F. Weaver and his wife Edith, at the Sharon Hill Market near Philly. This initial successful venture led to what became the Victor F. Weaver poultry plant.

The history of the Company is being showcased by the NH Area Historical Society at its Museum on the 2nd Floor of the Kauffman Building. The Museum is open Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays, 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Take this opportunity to learn about this local entrepreneur and see what the Museum has to offer.

Items w/ Freon--\$10; Candle wax—**NO** containers; old towels, blankets, animal crates and bowls; Computer components—**NO** TVs; and Styrofoam—**NO** packaging peanuts or swim noodles.

Street Sweeping Schedule

Tuesday, April 16

(Rain date: 4/17)
Streets will be swept on their ODD Numbers side.

Wednesday, April 17

(Rain date: 4/18)—
All streets will be swept on their EVEN Numbers side.
NOTE: Cul de sacs will be swept completely on the first day. The sweepers may also do a portion of the other side of the street on the first day, but will complete it as necessary

the following day. Residents are urged to sweep the remaining cinders on the sidewalks out onto the street curb line before the sweeping day. The Police Dept. works with the sweepers and will place tickets upon vehicles which were not removed from the posted areas.

Recycle: Plastics 1-5; glass, aluminum/tin cans; all cardboard; phone books, shredded paper, paperback books. Take TVs to LCSWMA.

Yard Sales

If you are planning on having a yard sale, you must register with the Boro Office. You may only use Boro signs around town. Earl Twp. residents are reminded that only Yard Sale signs obtained from the Boro Office may be posted in the Boro, all other signs will be removed.

Street Lights

If a street light is not working properly, write down the address where the pole is, along with the two sets of pole numbers on the pole and call the Boro Office. We will then contact PPL so they can repair it.

Tax Reminder

When paying your Spring Taxes at the Boro Office, be sure to bring both halves of the bill so that your half can be receipted!

Boro Office Drop Box

Boro Office Hours are: Mon-Fri, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. There is a drop box for payments next to the front door. If a bill is due on a Friday or over a weekend, be sure it is in the drop box before 7 a.m. Monday morning or it will be delinquent.
