Over time, the monument and plaques have weathered and deteriorated. It is time to restore and make improvements to the monument and plaques in order to save them for viewing and contemplation by future generations.

A plan to save the Memorial, the monument and plaques has been developed.



The estimated cost to complete the necessary work is approximately \$25,000. To date, over \$15,000

Important Trash and Recycling Info

Effective January 24, 2013, under the new PA law called Covered Devices Recycling Act, TVs, desktop computers, laptops, monitors, keyboards, mouse, printers, speakers or e-readers are NO LONGER ALLOWED in the trash. You can take computer and related items to LCSWMA or the Goodwill store location at 1367 Weaverville Rd., East Earl (445-6016). **However, TVs can only be taken to LCSWMA.**

Leaf Pick up: 10/10, 10/24, 11/7, 11/21 & 12/5
Trash Pick up changes:
New Years: 1/4
Memorial Day: 5/31
July 4: 7/5
Labor Day: 9/6
Thanksgiving: 11/29
Christmas: 12/27

If you pay your trash service for the year by February 1, you get a \$10 discount. Pay your full quarterly water and sewer portion and add \$175 for trash when you pay your bill.

Items you can recycle: Plastic containers and bottles #1 through #5—keep the lids ON the bottles; steel and aluminum cans; glass jars and bottles; newspaper; all cardboard; office paper; phonebooks and paperback books. All of these items can go in the same green recycling bin.

Tax Reminder

When paying your Spring Taxes at the Boro Office, be sure to bring both halves of the bill so that your half can be receipted!

Snow and Ice Removal

Snow and/or ice must be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours after a snow fall. Vehicles must be removed from the end of a cul de sac during a snow fall so that plowing may occur. The Boro does extend its appreciation to those who go the extra effort to clear snow from fire hydrants

and corners where it accumulates due to the plowing of streets.

Snow is NOT ALLOWED to be placed in the street.

Earl Township residents are reminded that only Yard Sale signs obtained from the Boro Office may be posted in the Boro, all other signs will be removed.

Boro Office Drop Box

Boro Office Hours are: Mon-Fri, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. There is a drop box for payments next to the front door. If a bill is due on a Friday or over a weekend, be sure it is in the drop box before 7 a.m. Monday morning or it will be delinquent.

North Hoover Wells Update

The New Holland Boro Authority is in the beginning stages of restoring the North Hoover Avenue wells back to service. Some preliminary work is scheduled to be underway in the next few weeks. Bids for the work to install the new

air-stripping process to eliminate the potentially hazardous Tetrachloroethylene (PCE) contaminant from the water are expected to be received in late winter. It is hoped the wells can be returned to service by early summer.

Reporting Street Lights

If a street light is not working properly, write down the address of the pole along with the two sets of pole numbers on the pole and call the Boro Office. We will then contact PPL so they can repair it.
