July 3, 2017

New Holland Borough Council met in regular session on Tuesday, July 3, 2017 at 7 p.m. in Borough Hall. Members present were President Donald J. Herrington, Vice-President Todd C. Burkhart, Patrick K. Morgan, James S. Bailey, Terry S. Mohler and John A. Styer. Member John A. Armbrust was absent. Manager/Secretary J. Richard Fulcher was also present. Others in attendance included Borough water consultant Jeff Bologa of Becker Engineering and Borough residents Bill Kassinger, Patricia Smith and Andy Herrington.

President Herrington opened the meeting, asking for action on the Minutes of Council's previous meeting.

Terry Mohler made the motion that the Minutes of Council's meeting of June 6, 2017 be approved as distributed. This was seconded by Patrick Morgan and passed.

Patrick Morgan made the motion that the monthly Financial Report be accepted and the bills paid as prepared. This was seconded by Jim Bailey and passed.

Property Committee Chairman Bailey made the motion that Change Order #4 for the Police Department expansion project with McGenCon, be approved as reviewed and recommended by the Architect, with a cost increase of an additional \$3,248. This was seconded by Patrick Morgan and passed.

Acting for the Water/Wastewater Committee this evening, Terry Mohler made the motion that proposed Ordinance #581, which updates the Borough's Water and Wastewater specifications be adopted; as reviewed and advertised by the Solicitor. This was seconded by John Styer. The roll was:

The motion passed. Ordinance #581 was adopted.

Streets Chairman Mohler made the motion that the request of Illusions Sight and Sound Lighting and radio station WIOV, for the closing of East Jackson Street

between South Kinzer Avenue and Park Avenue, for a concert and related activities, on Friday, July 14, 2017 from 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. be approved; noting that the requesting parties are responsible for traffic control. This was seconded by Jim Bailey and passed.

With the Mayor absent due to illness and the Acting Chief delayed on his way to the meeting, Police Committee Chairman Burkhart reviewed the monthly Police Report summary. He noted there were five felonies and misdemeanors and seven summary offenses during the month; three reportable and four non-reportable accidents, in the Borough the past month. Acting Chief Heisse was part of an Eagle Scout review committee, attended the planning for the New Holland Auto Group's Family Day scheduled for July 8 and participated in the county's ARD panel. One family in the Borough was so appreciative of the participation and support at a cardiac emergency even though the person was dead at the scene, they sent a card with gift certificates to Subway for all officers. He also noted that though it is not contained in the monthly Report, it was through the recent assistance and awareness of Officer J. T. Young who due to his awareness of the situation, assisted the East Lampeter Police Department recently related to a stolen vehicle and hit and run in upper Leacock Township. On behalf of the Mayor, he reported the monies received through the Police Department the past month as \$934.29 from the District Justice's office; \$255 from Accident Reports; and \$20 in parking fines.

Manager Fulcher reported that he has approved the plan for the initial security camera set up at Community Memorial Park to move forward.

There being no further business or public comment, the meeting was adjourned at 7:14 p.m.
