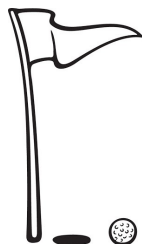
Pool & Golf Info

Street Overlay Work Scheduled

The major street overlay work planned by the Borough this year is scheduled for Redwood, Pine and Cottonwood Lanes and E. Conestoga from Railroad to Roberts. This work is projected to begin the end of May. Affected property owners will receive additional info closer to the time.

Downspouts Relocation Improvements Planned

Using a phased approach to reducing the amount of rainwater that ultimately ends up on the street, the Borough will be working with property owners to redirect this water to flow onto grass or garden areas. The northwest drainage area of the Borough will be the first older area of town to address the high volume of rainwater which is discharged from downspouts. The area initially involved includes the 500 block of W. Broad St., Westfield Dr. and W. Conestoga St. Downspouts which ultimately empty to the street are to be re-directed to empty onto the yard. This process should help remove thousands of gallons of water from a street surface and the Borough's storm-water system, reducing the flows downstream.

Sewer Backup or Water Leak

If you have a sewer line backup or a water leak after the normal Borough public works working hours of 7 a.m.- 3:30 p.m. weekdays, you should first contact your plumber to see if it is in your service line. If you call the Borough after hours and an employee responds and identifies the issue as the property owner's responsibility, the owner is responsible for the cost of the response and will be billed by the Borough.

Yard Sales

You must register at the Borough for a YARD SALE and may only use Borough signs around town. Earl Twp. residents are reminded that only signs obtained from the Borough Office (\$2 for the allowable two signs) may be posted in the Borough, all others will be removed.

New Well Set for Completion

The Borough Water Authority is happy to announce that after a number of uncontrollable equipment delays, the new well and treatment building are set to be brought online in May. This will follow the successful completion of a series of final tests.

The new well provides additional service capacity and also back up redundancy to the system's supply network.
