## *Community Trash Program*

After an extended period of avoiding the significant changes and increased costs within the waste industry, a new contract and possibly a new hauler will be coming for 2022. Based on the increased costs over the past few years, a similar major impact on cost is anticipated in the Boro as elsewhere. REMINDER: Keep a one-foot open space between your waste and recycling totes so the equipment arm on the truck can work efficiently.

## *Yardwaste Collection*

The last weekly yard waste pickup is 10/14. The fall yardwaste collection dates are: 10/21, 11/4, 11/18, 12/2, 12/16. The bags may be purchased for 50¢ each at the Boro Office. Leaves and grass are not to be blown, gathered or placed on the street or against the curb.

## *Traffic Signal Awaits Equipment*

The traffic signal at Main/Diller-Mentzer is still awaiting special equipment replacement from the factory. Similar to many current equipment replacement needs, there is no normal time frame anymore.

## *Pet Owners*

Dogs and cats are not allowed to be loose off of an owner's property, & must be cleaned up after when walked. ATTENTION: If you are feeding a stray cat, you will be held responsible for that animal & be considered its owner.



## *Snow Removal*

Snow and/or ice is to be removed from sidewalks within 12 hours after a snow fall. Vehicles must be removed from the end of a cul de sac during a snow fall so that plowing may occur.

## *MS4 Pool Reminder*

Pool owners are reminded to allow your pool water to stand for a few days so the chlorine can dissipate before emptying your water. The water is to be drained into your outside sewer vent or slowly onto your yard.

## *Don't Drive Thru Flooded Streets*

When intense heavy rainstorms occur and the normal collection system is overwhelmed in low areas, a number of streets in low areas temporarily over-flow from the system. This can also occur elsewhere during flash-flood conditions. Do not drive through these flooded areas. There is no guarantee the road surface is still intact. It also causes damage to the adjoining properties from the rippling impacts. It only takes six inches of water to cause a vehicle to start to float. It is unsafe and against the law to drive thru flood waters that cause a street to be closed.
