NEW HOLLAND BOROUGH LANCASTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA LANCASTER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA ORDINANCE No. 2023 – 598

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE NEW HOLLAND BOROUGH CODE CHAPTER 7 (FIRE PREVENTION & FIRE PROTECTION) BY ADDING PART 5 (CONSUMER FIREWORKS) TO REGULATE CONSUMER FIREWORKS IN NEW HOLLAND BOROUGH

WHEREAS, Act 74 of 2022, House Bill 2157, P.N. 3332, was adopted by the General Assembly on July 6, 2022, was signed by the Governor on July 11, 2022, amends Title 3 Pa.C.S. Chapter 11 (herein also "Fireworks Law" or "Law"), and became effective on September 9, 2022;

WHEREAS, the Fireworks Law governs the sale, purchase, and use of Consumer Fireworks and Display Fireworks in the Commonwealth;

WHEREAS, the Fireworks Law authorizes Pennsylvania municipalities to prohibit or restrict certain uses of Consumer Fireworks as defined in the Law if the municipality determines that certain conditions are met;

WHEREAS, the Fireworks Law authorizes the adoption of local rules and regulations by New Holland Borough, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania (herein also "Borough"), that govern permit approvals;

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the full authority provided by the Fireworks Law should be exercised in the interests of public safety;

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that Consumer fireworks may not be utilized in the Borough within one hundred and fifty feet (150') of a building or vehicle, or within three hundred feet (300') from an animal housing facility or fenced area designed to confine livestock owned or managed by another person;

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the use of Consumer Fireworks place such buildings, vehicles, and animals in potential danger; and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to regulate the use of Consumer Fireworks within the Borough limits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the New Holland Borough Council (herein also Borough Council") that the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of New Holland (herein also "Code") Chapter 7 (Fire Prevention & Fire Protection) is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. Amendments. Code Chapter 7 (Fire Prevention & Fire Protection) is amended by adding a new Part 5 (Consumer Fireworks) as follows:

Part 5

Consumer Fireworks

§501. Definitions. For purposes of this Part, the following words and phrases, when used in this Part, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section, except where the context or language clearly indicates or requires a different meaning:

consumer fireworks – Any combustible or explosive composition or any substance or combination of substances that are intended to produce visible or audible effects by combustion; is suitable for use by the public; complies with the construction, performance, composition, and labeling requirements promulgated by the Consumer Products Safety Commission in 16 CFR (relating to commercial practices) or any successor regulation; and complies with the provisions for "Consumer Fireworks" as defined in APA 87-1. Consumer fireworks does not include devices such as "ground and hand-held sparkling devices", "novelties", or "toy caps".

PERSON – Any individual, partnership, group, association, or other entity of any kind.

- §502. Consumer Fireworks Prohibited in Borough. In accordance with Title 3 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, Chapter 11, Section 1106(a)(l.2) [as adopted and created by House Bill No. 2157], it is hereby ordained and enacted that the use, ignition, or discharge of Consumer Fireworks within the Borough shall be and is hereby prohibited, except as otherwise provided in this Part.
- §503. Permits. Any person owns, possesses, or has the legal right to access a location (other than Borough parks, roads, or properties) upon which they desires to use, ignite, or discharge Consumer Fireworks not within one hundred and fifty feet (150') of a building or vehicle, or three hundred feet (300') from an animal housing facility or fenced area designed to confine livestock owned or managed by another person, may submit an application for permission to use, ignite, or discharge Consumer Fireworks to the Borough Manager, or the Borough Manager's designee.

If the Borough Manager or designee for same determines that the above conditions are met, the applicant shall be granted permission to use, ignite, or discharge the Consumer Fireworks on the day and time listed in the application, but in no event later than 10:00 P.M. Such applications for the use, ignition, or discharge of Consumer Fireworks shall be submitted at least six (6) weeks in advance of the date of the requested use.

§504. Rules and Regulations. The Borough Manager is authorized to promulgate administrative rules and regulations regarding the implementation of the provisions of Section 503, which rules and regulations, as amended from time-to-time, shall be effective upon their posting on the Borough's publicly accessible website.

§505. No Fireworks on Borough Streets, Sidewalks, or Properties. Except as otherwise permitted in this Part, no Fireworks shall be used, ignited, or discharged on Borough Streets, sidewalks, or any property owned by the Borough including, without limitation, Borough parks and buildings.

§506. Notice to Judges and Magisterial District Justices. The Borough Manager, or the designated staff thereof, shall be authorized and are directed to provide certified copies of this Chapter to all Judges and Magisterial District Justices having jurisdiction over any part of the Borough, in order to provide judicial notice that except as otherwise provided in this Part, no permission has been granted by the Borough for any person to intentionally use, ignite, or discharge Consumer Fireworks within the Borough, or on the Borough's sidewalks, streets, or other properties.

§507. Penalties. Any person who possesses, uses, ignites, or discharges Consumer Fireworks in violation of any one or more provisions of this Part, for the first offense commits a summary offense, and upon conviction shall, in addition to any other penalty authorized by law, be punishable by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) per violation. Each subsequent offense under this Part committed within three years of a prior conviction shall constitute a summary offense, and upon conviction shall, in addition to any other penalty authorized by law, be punishable by a fine of not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1000) per violation.

Section 2. Severability. If any article, part, section, provision, regulation, limitation, restriction, sentence, clause, phrase, or word in this Ordinance shall, for any reason, be declared to be illegal, unconstitutional, or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect nor impair the validity of this Ordinance or any other remaining article, part, section, provision, regulation, limitation, restriction, sentence, clause, phrase, word, or remaining portion of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of Borough Council that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such illegal, unconstitutional, or invalid article, part, section, provision, regulation, limitation, restriction, sentence, clause, phrase, or word not been included herein.

133	Section 3. Repealer. All other ordinances or parts thereof that are inconsistent or in
134	conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed and rescinded to the extent of such inconsistency
135	or conflict.

137	Section 4. Continuing Validity. Except as specifically described in this Ordinance, all
138	relevant codes, ordinances, regulations, and policies of the Borough shall remain in full force and
139	effect as previously enacted and amended.

141	Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its being duly
142	enacted.
