Street Sweeping Process Change

The Boro will be using a dif-
ferent approach to its Street
Sweeping process this spring.
Make a note of where your address
is on the schedule below and make
sure your vehicles are removed from
the street on the appropriate day.
The streets will be scheduled
(depending on weather) as follows:

Monday, April 8: EVEN number side
of all streets on the **NORTH** side of
town (which consists of all streets
north of Main Street) {including cul
de sacs, dead ends and all of the
north side of Main Street}

Tuesday, April 9: EVEN number
side of all streets on the **SOUTH**
side of town (which consists of all
streets south of Main Street)
{including cul de sacs, dead ends
and all of the south side of Main
Street}

Wednesday, April 10: ODD number
side of all streets on the **NORTH**
side of town

Thursday, April 11: ODD number
side of all streets on the **SOUTH**
side of town

Friday, April 12: Sweeping of any
missed areas

The Police Dept. can place tickets on
vehicles that were not removed from
the posted areas.



Butterfly Garden Time

The grading and ground prepara-
tion work is scheduled to get un-
derway as the weather allows. Ger-
ald G. Martin and Sons is donating
this work to make the Garden a
reality. Following this phase, the
ensuing elements will begin to be
installed: water piping and yard
hydrants; electric wire with the
concrete bases for lighting fixtures
and service connections; trail pav-
ing; the concrete Butterfly Legacy
Wall; the Brick Memorial area; the
plantings and fencing. The Com-
munity Memorial Park continues its
fundraising campaign in order to
enhance the Garden with educa-
tional Kiosks. Donations

Tennis & Pickleball Project

The Boro will be working with the Board of Community Memorial Park to rehabilitate the two tennis court areas at Community Park. An area group of pickleball players is also supporting the project. One court is to remain for tennis, the other is to be converted for pickleball use. This projected \$235,000 project is being financed in part by a grant of \$125,000 received from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Commonwealth Financing Authority. The project is anticipated to start in the late spring. Because the curing period for the new asphalt and the paint markings is about six weeks, the courts are projected to be closed for approximately three months once the project begins.

The Park Board continues its fundraising effort to support the local cost of this project. Donations to the project can be sent to: Community Memorial Park Assoc., PO Box 62, New Holland, PA 17557. The check should be marked: "Tennis/Pickleball".



Stormwater Pollution Prevention

Stormwater is water that runs off surfaces such as roofs, roads, etc. when it rains or snow melts. Runoff that does not seep into the ground will go into drains or low spots which lead to streams/creeks. You are able to help keep our streams healthy by picking up after your pet; washing your car in your yard instead of your driveway and keeping leaves and grass clippings out of the road so the storm drains won't get clogged. Sewer Backup or Water Leak

If you have a sewer line backup or a water leak after the normal Boro public works working hours of 7 a.m.- 3:30 p.m. weekdays, you should first contact your plumber to see if it is in your service line. If you call the Boro after hours and an employee responds and identifies the issue as the property owner's responsibility, the owner is responsible for the cost of the response and will be billed by the Boro.

Yard Sales

You must register at the Boro for a YARD SALE and may only use Boro signs around town. Earl Twp. residents are reminded that only signs obtained from the Boro Office (\$2 for the allowable two signs) may be posted in the Boro, all others will be removed.

Pool & Golf Info

Pool info and membership forms should be available on the Boro's website and at the Office in mid-April. A \$10 pool membership discount is applied if paid by 5/10. Opening day for the pool is planned to be June 8. Group and Private Swim Lessons are currently planned on being available.

Please put the money in an envelope, place it in the drop box beside the front door and take the bags from the black bin. They will also be available at the Golf Shop in the Seymour building at Community Memorial Park during the day, evenings, weekends and holidays when there is staff in the Golf Shop.

No work should be done on your structure or property without first contacting the Boro Office to see if a Building Permit is required.
