Tree Branch & Shrubbery Trimming

Tree limbs hanging above your sidewalk must be cut at least 7 ft. above the sidewalk. All shrubs encroaching the sidewalk or corners must also be trimmed back so they are not touching the sidewalk or affecting corner stop intersection clear site views. If this is not completed by 7/10, the Boro plans to do the trimming and charge the property owner for the time and labor.

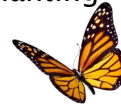


Police Night Out Returns

After losing a window of opportunity in the early spring partially due to weather, the groundbreaking is to be rescheduled for this fall. If all of the major infrastructure is able to be set in place before late fall, it should allow a good planting period.



Pet Owners

Dogs and cats are not allowed to be loose off of an owner's property, & must be cleaned up after when walked. **ATTENTION:** If you are feeding a stray cat, you will be held responsible for that animal & be considered its owner.

Yard Sales

You must register at the Boro for a YARD SALE and may only use Boro signs around town. Earl Twp. residents are reminded that only signs obtained from the Boro Office (\$2 for the allowable two signs) may be posted in the Boro, all others will be removed.

Recycling Info

RECYCLE THE BIG 4—Corrugated Cardboard, Plastic Bottles and Jugs with Necks (throw away the lids), Metal Food and Beverage Cans, Glass Bottles and Jars. When in doubt, **THROW IT OUT!** Lancaster County has a waste-to-energy process that converts trash into renewable energy.

Building Permits

No work should be done on your structure or property without first contacting the Boro Office to see if a Building Permit is required.



Stormwater Reminders

Stormwater regulations include these reminders:

*No blowing or placing of grass clippings on the street.

*Pools are no longer able to be emptied onto the street. This is now required to be placed in the municipal sewer system through your dwelling.

*Where possible, when washing your vehicle, do so on your grass area.

*Roof downspouts when possible should empty onto your yard, not onto the street

Airbnb Regulations

In an effort to maintain the quality of life and property values in its traditional residential neighborhoods, such things as Airbnbs, VRBOs (any short term rentals) are NOT permitted in the Boro's residentially zoned neighborhoods. As this type of activity may lead to numerous problems, everyone is urged to help protect the community by helping monitor for and reporting any appearance of such activity to the Boro Office.

Sewer Backup or Water Leak

If you have a sewer line backup or a water leak after normal Boro public works working hours of 7 a.m.- 3:30 p.m. weekdays, you should first contact your plumber to see if it is in your service line. If you call the Boro after hours and an employee responds and identifies the issue as the property owner's responsibility, the Boro will bill the owner for the cost of the response.

Borough Office Drop Box

Borough Office Hours are: Mon-Fri, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. There is a drop box for payments next to the front door. If a bill is due on a Friday or over a weekend, be sure it is in the drop box before 7 a.m. Monday morning or it will be delinquent.
