If the item is not picked up by 10 a.m. Friday, call the office again and let us know. Oversized item tag days are marked in Red on the Calendar.

COST UPDATE—After three years of delaying various price increases to program participants, more realistic costs are reflected with the 2025 program. The new cost will be \$340 (\$85/quarter) per year. The January prepay \$10 discount is continued. Residents are urged to comparison shop if dissatisfied.

Lancaster County Remains in Drought Watch

Due to lower rain volumes over much of 2024 (and 2023), Lancaster County remains in a Drought Watch. It is requested that people continue to exercise voluntary reductions in non-essential water use.



Snow Removal

Sidewalks must be cleared of snow and ice within 12 hours after a snow fall. Vehicles must be removed from the end of a cul de sac during a snow fall so that plowing may occur. **Do not throw or blow** snow out onto a roadway.



Traffic Signal Repair Delays Continue

The Borough continues to wait for the replacement parts needed for signal repair of the three (current) intersections. They are repaired as parts become available.
