Street Sweeping Process Change

The Boro will be using the same approach to its Street Sweeping process this spring. Make a note of where your address is on the schedule below and make sure your vehicles are removed from the street on the appropriate day. The streets will be scheduled (depending on weather) as follows:

Tuesday, April 22: **EVEN** number side of all streets on the **NORTH** side of town (which consists of all streets north of Main Street) {including cul de sacs, dead ends and all of the north side of Main St.}

Wednesday, April 23: **EVEN** number side of all streets on the **SOUTH** side of town (which consists of all streets south of Main Street) {including cul de sacs, dead ends and all of the south side of Main Street}

Thursday, April 24: **ODD** number side of all streets on the **NORTH** side of town

Friday, April 25: **ODD** number side of all streets on the **SOUTH** side of town

Mondy, April 28: Sweeping of any missed areas

The Police Dept. can place tickets on vehicles that were not removed from the posted areas.

2025 Starting out as a Dry Year

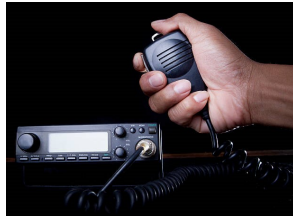
2025 so far has started out to be another dry year. Please be mindful of this concern as the warmer weather occurs and conserve water where you can.

Locust St. Street & Water Service Project Underway

The planned water and service lines replacement project for the entire street as well as the street widening of the eastern portion has begun. The Boro was fortunate to be awarded a \$746,508 grant towards this one-million dollar project. The Boro Authority is providing the required local funding for this project. The project is planned to be ending by early July depending on weather.

Stormwater Pollution Prevention

Stormwater is water that runs off surfaces such as roofs, roads, etc. when it rains or snow melts. Runoff that does not seep into the ground will go into drains or low spots which lead to streams/creeks. You are able to help keep our streams healthy by picking up after your pet; washing your car in your yard instead of your driveway and keeping leaves and grass clippings out of the road so the storm drains won't get clogged. Sewer Backup or Water Leak

If you have a sewer line backup or a water leak after the normal Boro public works working hours of 7 a.m.- 3:30 p.m. weekdays, you should first contact your plumber to see if it is in your service line. If you call the Boro after hours and an employee responds and identifies the issue as the property owner's responsibility, the owner is responsible for the cost of the response and will be billed by the Boro.

Yard Sales


You must register at the Boro for a YARD SALE and may only use Boro signs around town. Earl Twp. residents are reminded that only signs obtained from the Boro Office (\$2 for the allowable two signs) may be posted in the Boro, all others will be removed.

Pool & Golf Info

Pool info and membership forms should be available on the Boro's website and at the Office in mid-April. A \$10 pool membership discount is applied if paid by 5/9. Opening day for the pool is planned at this time to be Saturday, May 31. Group and Private Swim Lessons are currently planned on being available.
