New Community Trash & Recycling Hauler

The result of the recent bid opening for the upcoming program cycle identified Good's Disposal as the Borough's next hauler, beginning 2026. Thursday will remain the regular pick up day. Recycling will return to every week. In providing a preliminary review, Borough Manager Fulcher noted he feels the increased costs will impact a customer's expenses approximately an additional 60¢ per week. The January pre-pay discount is to continue for those desiring to take advantage of it. Current hauler A. J. Blosenski anticipates collecting its toters at the time of its last collection day, Friday, December 26 and Saturday the 27th. Good's then intends to distribute its toters the following week. Those on the program not needing toters should call the Borough office to be removed from the distribution list.

Butterfly Garden Enhances Community

The new Butterfly Garden established through the sponsorship of the Community Park Board has drawn a large amount of interest. After going through a successful initial season, the plants and flowers should continue to mature and become more attractive. Most people have respected the need for the additional visiting conditions due to the sensitivity of the pollinators. Some remedial work remains to be done. Emergency Preparedness

Families are urged to be prepared particularly for those possible power and/or phone service outages caused by wind, ice or other elements. Having enough food, medicine and blankets on hand can help keep you safer. If you use any type of temporary heating system, be sure it is vented to the outside. As a reminder, along with temporary situations, families should teach their children what to do and how to evacuate in case of a fire and members becoming separated. Being prepared and avoiding panic can go a long way in making life a little safer.

Sewer System Reminders

- Do NOT flush tampons or “flushable” wipes down the toilet. They do not biodegrade and can cause clogs in the sewer system.
- Do NOT pour oil, grease or fats down the drain.
- After your frying pan has cooled, soak up the grease with paper towels and put the towels in the trash.
- Minimize the use of your garbage disposal. Put food scraps into the garbage.
- Never pour motor oils down the drain or allow them to leak onto the ground! This is illegal.



Snow Removal

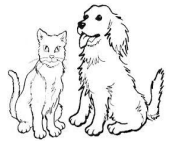
Snow and/or ice is to be removed from sidewalks within 12 hours after a snow fall. Vehicles must be removed from the end of a cul de sac during a snow fall so that plowing may occur.

Street Light Out

If a street light is not working properly, write down the address where the pole is, along with the two sets of numbers on the pole and call the Borough Office. We will then contact PPL to repair it.

Pet Owners

Dogs and cats are not allowed to be loose off of an owner’s property, & must be cleaned up after when walked. ATTENTION: If you are feeding a stray cat, you will be held responsible for that animal & be considered its owner.



Borough Airbnb Regulations

In an effort to maintain the quality of life and property values in its traditional residential neighborhoods, such things as Airbnbs, VRBOs (any short term rentals) are NOT permitted in the Borough’s residentially zoned neighborhoods. As this type of activity may lead to numerous problems, everyone is urged to help protect the community by helping monitor for and reporting any appearance of such activity to the Borough Office.
